Like thousands of others, Amanda wanted to do something to support the families of this tragedy, so she decided to sell lemonade and donate the proceeds to the victim's families. Amanda entrusted the money she collected in the three days she sold lemonade to the Chattanooga Navy League. Our President, Ron Galante, accepted her check on behalf of the victim's families and the board will decide how best to carry out Amanda's wishes. For her selfless act, Ron Galante made Amanda an honorary member of the Chattanooga Navy League and gave her a Chattanooga Navy League challenge coin and ball cap, which she proudly displayed at the Navy Operational Support Center on Amnicola highway. In addition, WDEF gave Amanda \$500 as the winner of their "Do the Right Thing" contest. 


their families, the way in which we responded to this senseless tragedy displayed our caring, generous and patriotic nature.



Join us Thursday, August 20th as we set sail aboard the Southern Belle Riverboat. Check in begins at 6:00 PM; we board at 6:30 PM. She gets underway at 7 PM and will return to port no later than 9:00 PM.

While enjoying our annual "tour of duty afloat", we will have a buffet dinner including Prime Rib and Chicken Wisconsin.

Located at Pier 2 (201 Riverfront Parkway) in Chattanooga under the Olgiati Bridge, the U.S. Coast Guard-regulated Southern Belle can hold her crew along with 450 passengers.

Designed by noted marine architect Captain Alan L. Bates, the Southern Belle was built at the Serodino Boat Yards in Guild, Tennessee, which is about 25 miles downriver from Chattanooga. She features an air-operated calliope and has been ported in Chattanooga since her 1985 launch.

Limited free parking is available on the street, and a Carta Parking lot is across the street from the pier. The Southern Belle provides golf-cart transportation from the drop-off point (under the Olgiati Bridge) to the boat.

Dress comfortably for the warm weather; low-heeled shoes are strongly recommended.
