Yes, the date for the eclipse has been changed to Aug 21 so that there is no interference with the summer Navy League - Chattanooga August 24th dinner!



Mr. Tom Halley is the Navy F-35C Manager for Business Development with the Lockheed Martin F-35 Joint Strike Fighter Program.

Mr. Halley, 1981 graduate of the University of Tennessee with a BS in Economics, he received his MBA from Austin Peay State University in 1984 and a Master of Arts degree in Strategic Studies from the United States Air Force, Air Command and Staff College in 1999. He is also a 2007 University of Virginia Darden School of Business, Executive Course graduate.

In a 28 year Naval Career, Mr. Halley flew over 4000 flight hours in the venerable A-4 Skyhawk and the F/A-18 Hornet and Super Hornet. He has accumulated over 700 carrier landings and has completed numerous carrier combat deployments in support of world-wide Naval missions. In 2009 he was selected as the "Tailhook Aviator of the Year" by the Tailhook Association.

During his time in the Navy he has had four command tours to include: Commanding Officer of Strike-Fighter Squadron 82 (VFA-82), Commander, Strike Fighter Wing Atlantic (CSFWL), and Commanding Officer of CREW Composite Squadron One in Baghdad, Iraq where he was in charge of the counter radio-controlled IED efforts for the U.S. Army.

His final Navy tour was as the Commanding Officer of the Hampton Roads NROTC Consortium which included: Old Dominion University, Norfolk State University, Hampton University and Regent University. Mr. Halley joined Lockheed Martin in July of 2013.

Those Navy Leaguers who attended the May 6th Change of Command ceremony when Lieutenant Commander Joseph D. Tanner assumed command of the Naval Operational Support Center (the "NOSC") from Lieutenant Commander Timothy R. White came away with a thrilling experience. Held amidst the splendor at the Tivoli Theatre with just the right amount of military pageantry, it underscored the solemn responsibilities and leadership that command of men imposes on those put in charge.

In this case, it was the recognition of LCDR Tim White by not only the Naval chain of command exemplified by his superior, Captain Mathew T Berta, head of the Navy Region Southeast, Reserve Component Command, who led the ceremony but also by Hamilton County Mayor, Jim Coppinger and Chattanooga Mayor Andy Berke, both of whom lavishly praised the heroism LCDR White exhibited on July 16, 2015, and his continued leadership of the NOSC under challenging conditions. Mayor Berke presented the "Key to the City" to White, an honor which, Berke noted, is very rarely done.
