President's Message

The Navy League of the United States was founded in 1902 with a clear three pronged mission:

- to support the members of the sea services and their families;
- to educate the American people and their elected leaders about the critical importance of sea power for their economic prosperity and national security;
- to help build America's future through successful youth programs such as the Naval Sea Cadet Corps.

One of the ways that the Naw league of the United States accomplishes this three pronged mission is through national memberships. There are two types of national memberships: Premium and E-Memberships.

The Premium membership dues structure is as follows:

- 1-Year Premium Individual-\$55
- 2-Year Premium-\$100 (saves \$10 over 1 year rate)
- 3-Year Premium-\$130 (saves \$35 over 1 year rate)
- 4-Year Premium-\$180 (saves \$40 over 1 year rate)
- 5-Year Premium-\$225 (saves \$55 over 1 year rate)
- Life Membership (to age 55)-\$1,000
- Life Membership (to age 56-75)-\$750
- Life membership (age 76+)-\$500

The annual E-Membership is \$25. The principle difference between the two types of memberships is that with the E-membership the *Seapower* Magazine and annual *Seapower Almanac* is received as a digital edition instead of a U. S. mailed magazine edition. Both memberships are available online at https://NavyLeague.org/Memberships.






Honored recipients, featured left to right: Patty Parks, Ray Adkins, Carl Levi and Ron Galante.

In the same ceremony, the CAVC also presented their "Founders" and "Charles H Coolidge" awards to Carl Levi and Ray Adkins, respectively, well known contributors to local veteran support organizations.

Our Council is appreciative that the CAVC has recognized Ron's and Patty's contributions to veteran topics and welfare in our community.





The case, that is, for reinforcing the Naw! Charles "Chuck" Alsobrook, III, Hamilton County's newly appointed Veteran Service Officer, stepped out of his "day job" to educate and inform our group of the dire need for the US Nawy to rebuild its resources. Citing numerous examples of the strains and limits imposed by recent years' cutbacks in defense funding, he expertly defined the challenges ahead for our Nawy and the country. Current plans to grow the Nawy from 307 ships to 355 over several years are a positive sign but still are short of what is needed to maintain a global presence. Ship shortages mean longer deployments which mean greater sacrifices for our Nawy personnel.

2017 Dues now Due

As you may have noted in last month's Compass Points, there was an item about our dues structure. In case you may have skipped over it and found something more interesting to read, you are in luck! Here it is again:

As you probably know, there two parts to Navy League dues. The main one is the "national" dues which support and are collected by the national organization in Washington DC. They mail annual "re-up" reminders to members in the anniversary month of each member's membership after the first year. Those dues fund the national organization's activities in support of the Sea Services.

The other part (and the real reason for this article!) is that "local" dues for 2017 are now due. Local dues are used by our Chattanooga Council to help pay for our operating expenses, support of Sea Cadets, NJROTC programs and support of our local Active Duty Navy and Marine Corps members. Local Dues are \$15 per member or \$20 per couple (if both are members). This is such a BARGAIN!


