On DeckCaptain Kevin West For April 15 Dinner meeting

A native of Jackson, Michigan, Captain West joined the Navy later in life, getting a congressional waiver to enlist as a journalist at age 35 through the Navy Reserve's Advanced Pay Grade program. He had already been a working civilian journalist for 17 years prior to his enlistment and held a bachelor's degree from the University of Michigan. He received a direct commission a year-and-a-half after enlisting.

West has operational experience with Commander Naval Forces Europe-Commander Naval Forces Africa-Commander 6th Fleet (CNE-CNA-C6F) as Naval Forces Africa Public Affairs Officer for Africa Partnership Station exercises. He deployed in 2016/2017 as deputy public affairs director for Deputy Chief of Staff for Communications at Resolute Support head-quarters in Kabul, Afghanistan in support of Operation *Resolute Support*.

After receiving his commission, West was assigned to Navy Information Bureau 108 where he served as Division Officer of a unit that provided media training for flag officer selectees and NATO commanders deploying to Afghanistan. He served as public affairs officer for Commander Eastern Atlantic Detachment 108, trained Naval Media Center detachments in Guantanamo Bay, Bahrain, Diego Garcia, and Yokosuka, and created Navy Weeks for the Navy Office of Community Outreach.

He fleeted up to deputy director while assigned to Navy Reserve CNE-CNA-C6F. He deployed to Afghanistan during his tour with United States Fleet Forces Command and returned as deputy director for Navy Reserve Navy Information Commander Seventh Fleet, took on a similar role at Navy Public Affairs Support Element-West, then was appointed acting

Director of Navy Reserve Navy Public Affairs Support Element-Headquarters as a Commander before promoting to Captain and moving into his current assignment as Chief Of Staff.

West has been awarded the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, two Navy Commendation Medals, a Joint Services Achievement Medal, two Navy Achievement Medals, the Afghanistan Campaign Medal, and the NATO ISAF Medal. He is also authorized to wear the Navy Meritorious Unit Commendation Medal for his work with United States Fleet Forces Command.

West maintains his civilian radio broadcasting career as the program director for two News/Talk stations and news director for the Cumulus Radio group in Chattanooga, Tennessee. Civilian awards include Best Radio Newscast, Continuing News, General Reporting, Investigative Reporting, and Feature Reporting He has also won three Addy Awards. West lives with his wife and two step-children in Hixson, Tennessee. He has three grown children and five grandchildren.

Newest Navy League Member Rob Eldridge


