As we experience the summer temperatures of late May/early June, that's a signal that the Riverbend Festival is coming quickly. As matter-of-fact, the date for 2018 is June 8-16 and this marks the 37th year of the Festival that has become known in many circles as "The Tennessee Family Reunion."

The reason that I mention Riverbend is that during a part of Riverbend, the June 11-16 time period, the U. S. Navy will celebrate "Navy Week in Chattanooga" and will use Riverbend as a platform to celebrate the Naw throughout our community. Chattanooga is one of fourteen cities to have been selected as a "Navy Week City." Plans to date include, the U.S. Naw Fleet Forces Band greeting and performing for those early arrivals attending Riverbend, starting Sunday, June 10, 2018, 5:00 pm, at the main entrance (Chestnut Street and Aquarium Way) and continuing through Wednesday, June 13, 2018. Additionally, the U.S. Navy Brass Band will perform on the Unum Stage starting Thursday, June 14, through Saturday, June 16, at 5:00 pm. Plans also include participation in "The Strut" on Monday, June 11.

Again, this year, Riverbend will include a Military Appreciation Night at Riverbend, which will be on Wednesday, June 13, commencing at 8:30 pm just prior to the headline artist, Dustin Lynch. The program will include the Fleet Forces Band, service hymns of all branches of our military, a World War I remembrance as 2018 is the 100th anniversary and a massive reenlistment ceremony. A highlight of the evening will be the recognition of the crew members of USS TENNESSEE to which this Council has paid two visits and adopted the TENNESSEE as our boat. 

NJROTC Cadet Channel Lockett, a member of the Howard High School's Naval JROTC program, was awarded the Theodore Roosevelt Medal and Ribbon. League Director/Vice President/ Youth Program Director Stacy Kehoe presented the awards.

Rounding out the youthful participation in our meeting, two cadets from each unit presented the colors at the beginning of the awards dinner meeting.
